<p>What Do Parents and Families Say about P2P?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 85% of families reported that they are likely to contact P2P again in the future or attend a P2P training or event. • 90% of families report that, because of their call to P2P, they feel better able to support their child. • We moved, and I used the information she shared to communicate more effectively with my son's new school. Because of the resources shared with me, I was more prepared and understood what to say. • The response to my request for help was rapid. As a newly diagnosed parent, I appreciate her taking the time to listen. I didn't feel rushed at all.
